After Your Procedure

After your procedure, please note the following instructions:

- 1. Try sips of water. If tolerated, you may resume your regular diet or the diet recommended by your physician following your procedure.
- 2. Do not consume alcoholic beverages for 24 hours.
- 3. Do not drive, operate machinery, make critical decisions, sign documents, or perform activities that require coordination or balance for 24 hours following your procedure.
- 4. If you had a colonoscopy, air was placed in your colon during the procedure; expelling large amounts of air (gas) is normal.
- 5. Due to your preparation, you may not have a bowel movement for 1 to 3 days; this is normal.
- 6. If you had a polypectomy or biopsy, eat a soft, low fiber diet for 1 to 2 days.
- 7. Go directly to the emergency room if you notice any of the following:

Severe chest pain Persistent vomiting

Black, tarry stools Chills and/or fever over 101°

Any bleeding exceeding one tablespoon Severe abdominal pain other than gas cramps

- 8. Please carefully follow any instructions regarding anti-coagulation medications given to you by your physician following your procedure.
- 9. Unless otherwise instructed, you may continue your current medications and return to normal activities tomorrow
